The affective impact of music comes from a variety of factors, including intensity, time, rhythm and tonal relationships. The emotional coloring evoked by intensity, time and rhythm seems to be born from the association with the characteristics of human behavior in the corresponding condition; However, as and why particular tonal relationships in music convey distinct emotional effects are not clear. The hypothesis here examined is that the main and minor tone collections provoke different affective reactions because their spectra are similar to the spectrum of speech pronounced in different emotional states. To assess this possibility, spectra of the intervals that distinguish the main and minor music were compared with spectra of vocalized segments in excited and submissive speech using the basic frequency and frequency ratios such as measures. In line with the hypothesis, the spectra of main intervals are more similar to those found in the excited speech, while the spectra of particular minor intervals are more similar to the spectra of the submissive speech. These results suggest that the characteristic affective impact of the larger and smaller tone collections comes from routine associations made between particular musical intervals and voice.
